or remodeling the small cottage that became our current hospice headquarters, the photos depicted members of our community young and old lending a hand. They were up on ladders, wielding paintbrushes, drawing architectural plans, designing interior finishes, or installing office furniture and window shades. There were photos of the first hospice volunteer training showing community members learning patient care techniques such as safe transferring from bed to chair or brushing the teeth of a bedbound patient. This kind of community spirit was the spirit that carried this organization in its humble beginnings. So many helping hands and loving hearts have been there all along.

NEW FACES AT HOSPICE

Leilani Dumaguin, RN

Leilani met me in the Ohana Room in the hospice office with a warm, yet gentle smile. She seemed very grounded and centered. Describing

herself growing up in Mesa, Arizona as shy and reserved, Leilani now portrays herself as a good listener, a characteristic she feels particularly helpful in her role as a hospice nurse. Leilani was born and raised in the same house and she didn't leave Mesa, Arizona until she was 22, when she moved to Utah. At the technical high school where she graduated, Leilani spent half of her day taking regular high school classes and the other half learning nursing, so when she graduated, she already had a Certified Nurse's Aide certificate.

When Leilani was 14, her 15 year-old brother died and she became interested in "the art of healing." She went to nursing school at Scottsdale Community College, still living at home to save money. Happy to have graduated with no debt, she felt it was time to move out on her own. She sent out lots of applications and was selected for an on-call position as a hospice nurse at Rocky Mountain Hospice in Provo, Utah. Shortly thereafter she was promoted to case manager, for which she "felt underqualified," but feels that it was also "a blessing" because she "found my love for hospice work...it was meant to be." She is now pursuing a B.S. degree in nursing online and she hopes to complete her studies within a year and a half.

Six months after moving to Utah, at Christmas in 2013, she met her husband on a blind date. Kimo, Kona born and raised, had graduated from college in Utah, but had always planned to move back to Hawaii Island where his family had a coffee farm. They were married in June 2015 and they moved in with Kimo's mother in July 2016.

Kimo is a middle school teacher at Innovations Charter School and since his father passed away he also manages the family coffee farm in Captain Cook.

Although Leilani has only been on the island for a few months, she already feels very comfortable and excited with island life as it connects her with her "Polynesian heritage"-her dad is from Samoa and he always identified himself as an "Island Boy." He's very happy that she's living here and her parents are

hoping to move here themselves.

Off hours, she's learned to snorkel and she loves being in the ocean. She has to be careful where she's snorkeling, though, because Kimo is a spear fisherman!! Back in Mesa, Leilani sang in a number of large choral groups and would maybe like to join one here when she has the time.

Leilani started at North Hawaii Hospice in September 2016, and she has found that bedside care for hospice patients here is the same as it was in Utah. What's different here is that she finds way fewer resources, since it's so rural. She's living in North Kona and mostly working with patients in Waikoloa, and she and Kimo are saving to buy their own home. Leilani is very excited to be living here—she feels this will be her permanent home and she's learning more and more about island life and how she can help in her role as a hospice nurse—a position she feels called to.

Jennifer Real, MD

Meeting with Jennifer Real for the first time at the North Hawaii Community Hospital lobby, I was greeted with a wide smile and a warm handshake. She suggested we go outside to sit at an umbrellacovered table in a quiet inner courtyard where we could talk. Jennifer has been involved with North Hawaii Hospice (NHH) for about a year now since her sister-in-law, Rachel Real, LPN (an NHH nurse) recommended her.

I asked her to give me a short bio and she told me that she grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio and that it was her pediatrician grandfather that gave her the impetus to study medicine. Majoring in chemistry at Whittier College in California, she then went all the way east to study medicine at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York City. Coming back to the west coast to do her residency in internal medicine at UC San Diego, she also met her husband, David, who was then in the Navy. Her plans were to

become a pulmonary specialist, but when David was transferred to Virginia Beach, she became a hospitalist and she discovered that she liked this type of medicine.

When David got out of the Navy in 2012, they traveled all over the country looking for a piece of land where they could build a house and live off the land and off-grid. A friend recommended that they check out Hawaii Island, so they came here on vacation, fell in love with the island and she gave six months notice and they came over. Shortly after moving, North Hawaii Community Hospital had an opening for a hospitalist, so she had a job. They bought land in mauka Ninole and moved there with their two dogs. In eight months, David built them an off-grid house and spent lots of time getting rid of invasive trees, particularly guava, in order to allow the koa to grow. David has a sawmill and he's been milling the downed koa. They started an organic farm, called Bokoa (after their most special dog, Bo) and are now growing taro, pineapple, coffee, and avocados. They are home to 29 free range ducks, the first of which, Dolly, showed up under their bedroom window,

quacking at 5 am!!

Jennifer has taken up biking since moving here—she started in a spin class, then road biking, and now she loves to ride up mountains (Mauna Kea and Mauna Loa) on her mountain bike as well as participating in local races. She provides encouragement to people, especially other women, to get into biking.

As an animal lover, she has found herself picking

up pets on the side of the road and taking them home to care for them until she can find their owner or a new home. These are usually dogs, as Jennifer is allergic to cats. One day, however, on her way home from work, she saw a black kitten by the side of the road and she just had to stop. The kitten started "screeching" when it saw her, so Jennifer figured she had to do something. She found a box in the back of her truck and she told the kitten that if it jumped into the box, she would take it home. So,

of course, it jumped into the box. Unfortunately, after a short drive the kitten jumped out of the box and into the passenger seat, "screeching" away. Jennifer started freaking out, worried that the kitten was going to claw her, so she stopped driving and called her husband. He told her to stop worrying and just bring the kitten home! Luckily, the kitten jumped into a grocery bag, Jennifer tied the top shut and off they went. David was waiting when she drove up, picked up the kitten, hugged it to his chest and the kitten started purring away. David loves cats! They took care of it until Rachel's mother adopted the kitten and named it "Moxie," of which she has plenty.

The warmth that Jennifer showed me when we met is the same reason she likes working with hospice patients. She loves going into people's homes and getting to know them. She feels that "it's a privilege to be part of patients' lives" and she loves working with NHH where everyone is very nice. Jennifer wants to see NHH create a hospice home or inpatient facility here in Waimea, and she hopes to help make that vision a reality.

Raised on Oahu, she has been a resident of North Kohala since 1987.



Our hospice bereavement program offers individual support at our office, in home, or at the workplace for:

Please Note: You do not have to be in or have been in hospice to access support. There is no cost for services.

Circle of Support Groups (minimum of four) Offered periodically throughout the year.

Grief Group: A support group often helps healing begin. Educational materials made available.

Caregivers Coffee/Tea: Provides support and encouragement. Learn tips from others, educational materials available.

Youth: A variety of expressive/creative art forms are offered to help with communicating grief.

Youth Day Camp: During school breaks.

School Grief Group Outreach Program: Groups held at local schools.

Hotel/Business Staff Support: For loss of co-worker. This can be at the workplace to offer individual/group support. Expressive Art Groups: Art is an important means of expression that is particularly useful in grieving. It can help with expressing feelings and create moments of calmness.

Community Video Series and Group Discussion

This series includes a variety of videos covering topics such as living with purpose and gathering information for having a better life / being prepared for end of life issues. Videos are from PBS, TED Talks and other sources. Group conversations follow the video presentation.




