After more than 30 years of exceptional service to North Hawaii Hospice (NHH) as our medical director, John Dawson, MD, retired on December 31, 2018.

In the early 80s, when Dr. Dawson was asked when the right time to open a hospice in North Hawaii would be, his answer was: "Yesterday." As an internist and gerontologist in Waimea since the 70s, Dr. Dawson knew that the community needed such a resource. Dr. Dawson became a valued member of the founding committee led by NHH founder, Sheila Cadwallader. He continued his commitment and dedication to making quality, compassionate hospice care available in our community by serving as NHH's medical director since its inception in 1986. Dr. Dawson has faithfully cared for our patients and led our clinical staff members. He even volunteered his time for many years when NHH was just beginning and could not afford a medical director.

"Dr. D," as he is affectionately referred to by our clinical staff, has always been available - night and day - to answer phone calls from our hospice nurses. "He has been our rock," states Christine Richardson, RN, who has served North Kohala for NHH for more than 20 years. "We are going to miss him, but wish him well." In his retirement, Dr. Dawson will have more time to spend with his grandchildren on the mainland.

#### **Different Strokes for Different Folks**

At North Hawaii Hospice, we count on volunteers to serve in various ways from providing respite for our patients and their families to assisting with our community outreach efforts and fundraising events. We also rely on a strong cadre of **office volunteers** who show up week after week to help in our administrative offices.

**Office volunteers** often start at the front desk, answering phones and greeting visitors. As the entry point for much of what happens at our hospice, **office volunteers** very quickly become adept in how the office works and can branch out doing other tasks based on their skills and desires. Talent abounds among our **office volunteers**! Aunty Betty meticulously and precisely counts and rolls coins from our wishing well donation sites. Kath speedily puts together stacks of packets for patient families, new volunteers, and our clinical team. Dawna greets our visitors with a warm smile as she prepares materials for hospice group meetings. Chelsey works on a project to transition all patient volunteer files to an electronic format. Joan handily processes invoices in the business office. Elaine has cared for our potted plants, adorned the office with flowers, handled our recycling, helped in the business office, and she continues to manage the hospice library. When asked why she's stuck around for over a decade – "it's the people and the management, I feel appreciated." **Office volunteers** often come in for four hours a week or as needed to help with a project. Our staff depends on our **office volunteers** to free them up to focus on other aspects of their jobs or to fill in when staff are out.

**Office volunteers** come to us for different reasons such as to get involved in our community, to learn about hospice, to give back after a family member uses our services, or to connect with people after retiring. Sometimes it's just the satisfaction that comes from knowing they are helping others and feeling wanted. Or reasons become evident later – as in the case of a volunteer who unknowingly built a framework and network that supported her when her husband was diagnosed with a life-limiting illness and passed quite suddenly. Having a friendly place to go where you are valued and appreciated can help avoid idleness and loneliness.

Our **office volunteers** are crucial to the operation - working behind the scenes to help keep the administrative side of our work rolling along smoothly. The staff couldn't be more grateful for their time, service, and dedication to supporting the hospice mission.
